

POWER OF THE REDS

CONSIGNMENT GUIDELINES

The following is a set of guidelines to consign to the Power of the Reds Illinois Red Angus Sale.

1. Consignor must be a member of the Illinois Red Angus Association. If dues are not up to date at the time of sale, Sales Management will remove the membership dues and send to the Illinois Red Angus Association.
2. All registered Red Angus animals must have a Registration number with the Red Angus Association of America by sale time. If the registration number has not been obtained, settlement from the sale will not be completed until a registration number has been submitted.
3. All animals must have Veterinary Health Inspection paper at the time of sale check in complete with USDA Identification tags.
4. For every bull consigned, the consignor must put in one female. The only exception will be on behalf of a Junior who wishes to consign and does not have a female.
5. Every bull must have a minimum weight of 1,000 pounds and be semen checked. The only exception will be if a consignor wishes to consign a bull calf under the age of 1 year old or a bull calf on the side of a cow.

Commercial Female Eligibility Guidelines and Procedures

1. Animals must be 50% Red Angus.
2. Animals may be part of the RAAA tag program.
3. Animals must be open heifers or bred heifers.
4. Aged cows are not eligible for sale.
5. Animals will be viewed and approved by a Selection Committee prior to the sale.
6. A commission of 3% will be deducted from the sellers settlement check.
7. Animals will be sold in a maximum of groups of 5.
8. If the buyer does not want to take all animals in the pen, animals will be gate cut during the sale and the remaining animals sold.
